VILLAGE DEBUTS FOUR NEW HYBRID VEHICLES

To Aid Ongoing Efforts to Improve Village



Village of Hempstead Mayor Wayne J. Hall, Sr. and the Board of Trustees, in conjunction with the Department of Public Works, unveiled four new hybrid code enforcement vehicles. This is all part of the Village's efforts to protect the environment and improve the village.

“Ensuring a safe, clean, healthy environment in the Village is a responsibility that I take seriously,” stated Mayor Hall. “Our administration is always on the lookout for new and effective ways to improve our community. I would like to thank our Village employees for working hard to help accomplish this,” added Mayor Hall.

Since the mayor took office in 2005, about 20 new vehicles have been added to the fleet. Recent additions include a new garbage truck, a new flow and dump truck, a regular dump truck, a sewer jet truck for sewer maintenance, two new Hustler lawn mowers, a 14-foot plow for parking fields and a new truck for Department of Public Works services.
